RECIPIENTS OF OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM FOUNDATION ANN AND JON REYNOLDS SCHOLARSHIPS NAMED

Ronald C. Nahas, President of the Board of Directors of the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum Foundation, announced the recipients of the Ann and Jon Reynolds scholarships. The scholarships, named for former Coliseum Board Member/current Coliseum Foundation Board Member Jon Reynolds and his wife Ann, are for \$3,250 a year to a maximum of \$13,000 within a five-year period. They are awarded to graduating seniors from Alameda County high schools. Criteria include a 3.0 grade point average, two years of community service and a need for financial aid. Each awardee must stay in good academic standing and progress towards obtaining a baccalaureate degree to continue to receive the award.

JENNIFER AU graduated from James Logan High School. She has been accepted at UC Berkeley, UCLA, Princeton and Columbia. Her proposed major is molecular biology. Her grade point average was 4.64 and her SAT score was 2180. She served as treasurer and president of Rotary-sponsored Interact. While at Logan, she participated in track and field. She was especially active in tutoring her peers in various subjects. Other community service efforts included the nearby Masonic Home of California, performing clerical work and assisting in the skilled Nursing program. She also volunteered with Habitat for Humanity East Bay and donated time to Union City performing clerical work.

JANAE CHATMON graduated from Castro Valley High School with a 4.46 grade point average and a 1790 SAT score. She has been accepted for admission as USC, UC San Diego, UC Santa Barbara, UC Davis and UOP. Her proposed major is Biochemistry. She has had a successful high school track career and wants to be an obstetrician or general practitioner in the medical field. Community service during her high school years included Kid's Movin Up where she played, fed and read to toddlers. She was also involved in events in support of awareness and donations for Cancer and Alzheimer's in addition to participation within her church.

The Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum Foundation was established to honor Coliseum President Emeritus Robert T. Nahas and to oversee charitable programs associated with the Coliseum. The Foundation also awards the George P. Scotlan and Robert T. Nahas scholarships.
