RECIPIENTS OF OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM FOUNDATION GEORGE P. SCOTLAN SCHOLARSHIPS NAMED

Ronald C. Nahas, President of the Board of Directors of the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum Foundation announced the 2012 recipients of the George P. Scotlan Scholarships. The scholarships are for \$3,000 per year for a total of \$12,000 over four years. They are awarded to honor Scotlan, a former member of the Coliseum Board of Directors. He also served as Special Assistant for Urban Affairs to the UC Berkeley Chancellor at the time of his death.

MARIAH CARRAY graduated from Oakland Technical High School. Her grade point average was 4.37. She has been offered admission to, and has accepted, Macalester College. Her proposed major is International Studies. Her community activities include Rotary Interact, McCullum Youth Court, International Environmental Congress, Trek for Knowledge (in Malawi, Africa), Children of Uganda Clothing Drive (for which 1000 articles of clothing were gathered), and a church youth group Mission Trip to Washington, DC included volunteer feeding in homeless soup kitchens and restoring historic sites.

GRACE WOO graduated from Irvington High School with a 3.76 grade point average. She has been offered admission to UC Berkeley, UC San Diego and UC Davis. She will be attending UC Berkeley, majoring in English. She has already completed some college coursework at Ohlone College, in Fremont. She is the first generation in her family to attend a four-year college. She is a Seal Bearer Status California Scholastic Federation (CSF) member and has a book published. She donates 75% of book royalties to UNICEF. She also tutors younger students as part of her community service activities.

DANNY SON LE graduated from Skyline High School with a grade point average of 3.823. He has been offered admission to UC Santa Cruz, CSU Monterey Bay, San Jose State University and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. He will attend UC Santa Cruz with a proposed major in kinesiology & biology. While at Skyline HS he participated in the Rotary Interact Club and the Key Club. He also participated as a volunteer in the Oakland Running Festival and the 2010 and 2011 Aids Walks.
